The submitted presentation(s), incorporating a clear and precise title should be between 300-500 words and limited to an A4 page format. It should include the name, function, address, phone, e-mail, and affiliation of all the author(s) of the presentation together with a short description of the author(s) 'expertise. In case of multiple authors, only 1 person is allowed to present. The name of the speaking person should be mentioned. Submitted papers should be original ones, not previously published elsewhere, publicly presented or submitted in parallel to any other event. They should be informative, impartial. The Scientific Committee will review all submissions but will reject any commercial oriented ones.
